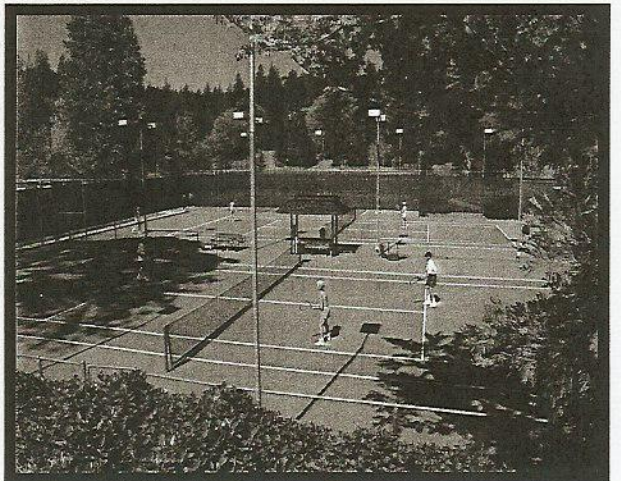
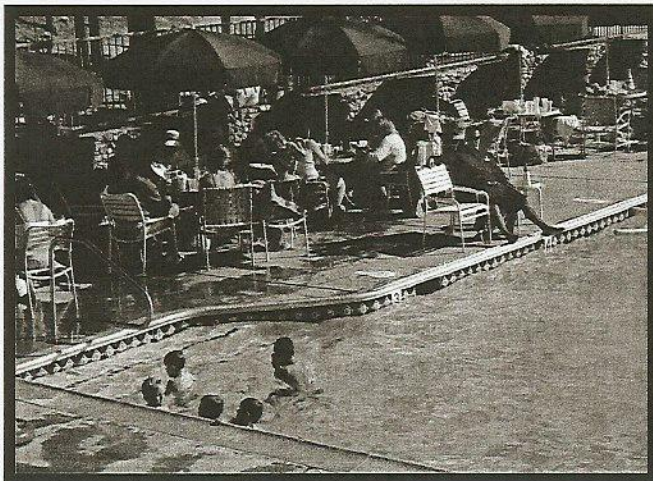
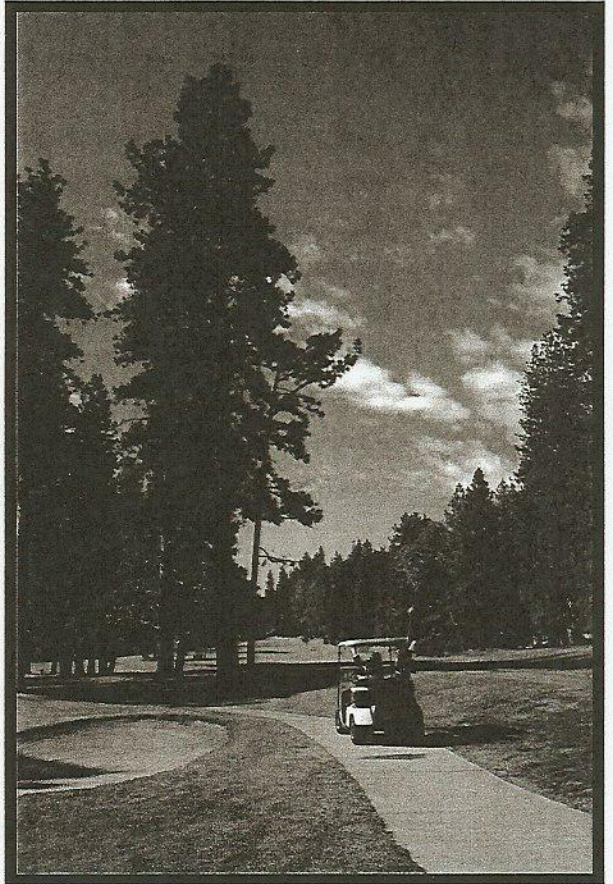
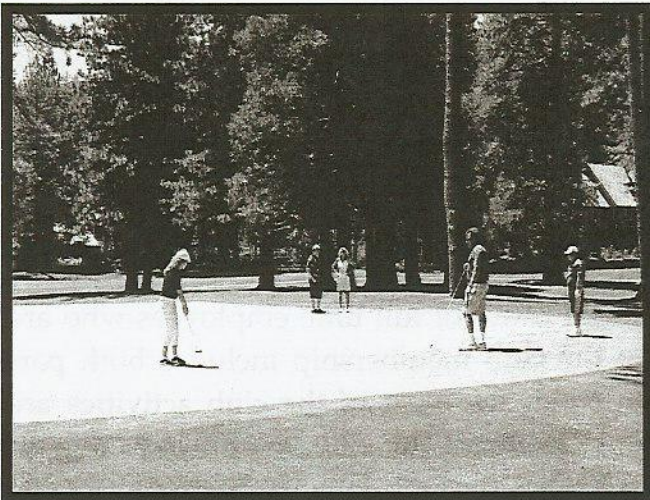




FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS



Is it easy for a new member to meet other members?

Yes. LACC prides itself on being a friendly club for both men and women. The Ambassadors Club assists new members in getting to know the existing members and make the process a more friendly experience. Ambassadors will welcome and mentor new members, introducing them to other members and club activities, such as golf (Men's and Ladies 18 hole golf, the Ladies Niners, Ladies Putters,) tennis, and social activities (there is an exciting full calendar scheduled this year). There is an Ambassador's Table set aside at each Saturday Night Dinner, so new members will always know someone to sit with and enjoy our club.



Is LACC open all year?

Yes and No. The club maintains a cadre of full time employees who are on site all year around. Since the club membership includes both part timers and full time mountain residents, most of the club activities are concentrated between April and October. The club continues to remain open on a limited basis from October through January to accommodate various dining and social activities.



Does LACC have a dress code?

Yes. It is geared to the relaxed atmosphere enjoyed in this mountain environment. As a general rule, tasteful and appropriate attire is expected at all times for both members and their guests and is generally described as "Country Club Casual". For example, denim is not allowed on the golf course, but may be worn in all other areas of the club.

What are the hours for the restaurant?

The food and beverage service is managed by our full time Clubhouse Manager Greg Harrison and our full time Executive Chef, Tom Mannion. LACC has three areas where food and drinks are served. The main upstairs dining room, the Summit, provides a place for lunch and evening meals as well as club parties. Reservations are usually required. Jackets are encouraged on Saturday nights. The downstairs dining room, the Pub, is more casual. The Pub is open for breakfast and lunch and occasionally for evening meals. Reservations are generally optional. The Outside Patio operates as an extension of the Pub and offers an opportunity to enjoy the beautiful mountain weather and the golf course views.



What facilities does LACC have for outdoors activities?

LACC has an 18 hole championship golf course, driving range and practice putting green, 7 tennis courts, including 1 clay court, and a swimming pool on the club grounds. As part of an arrangement with the Lake Arrowhead Lodge, our members also have access to the resort gym and spa facilities.



When does the golf course open for play?

The course is generally open from April through December. The club maintains a fully stocked Pro Shop staffed by full time Head Pro Tim Miskell, a PGA Master Golf Professional, who was recognized by Golf Digest in 2003-2004 as "Best Teacher In State" and Golf Magazine as "America's Most Outstanding Golf Teacher" in February, 2003, and two assistants. Since weather in the mountains is an overriding consideration,

course playability is determined by the full time Golf Course Superintendent, Armand LeSage, with concurrence by the Board.



Are there golf groups for men, women, and couples?

Yes. Golf is the principal activity at LACC. Equity golf memberships comprise the majority of our total memberships. The club offers many golf activities for golfers of all handicaps, both men and women. The men have a standing block of starting times each Wednesday. The ladies have a similar block of times each Tuesday. There are also Ladies 9 Holers and Ladies Putter groups, each having weekly get-togethers. Couples can play regularly on selected Fridays in the TGIF, which combines 9 holes of golf with dinner. In addition, both the men and women have several tournaments during the year. These include member-member, member-guest, invitational, and charity tournaments.



When is the tennis facility open for play?

The courts are generally open year round, weather permitting, with the main programs planned between the Memorial Day to Labor Day period. LACC maintains 2 full time Tennis Pro, Don Linebarger and Jackie Bathaver, to manage the daily and tournament play and to provide lessons to members.



Does LACC have Locker Room facilities?

Yes. There are separate Locker Rooms for men and women, each containing individual lockers, shower and bathroom facilities, and a separate card room. Members are often found playing bridge during the day.
